Verbs Ending in -ED

How to pronounce the -ed sound

Rule #1: If the stem of the verb ends in -T or -D, pronounce the -ED.

Verb stems ending in -T: Verb stems ending in -D:

 $star\underline{t}ed = start + ted$ pad $\underline{d}ed = pad + ded$

parted = part + ted lended = lend + ded

 $gree\underline{t}ed = greet + ted$ hea $\underline{d}ed = head + ded$

Rule #2: If the stem of the verb ends in any other letter, use the sound "tuh" instead of the "ed" sound.

 $trac\underline{k}ed = trackt$ He tracked the data.

centered = centert The chair was centered at the table.

 $tap\underline{p}ed = tappt$ He tapped his pen on the desk.

outlined = outlint She outlined the chapter.

 $mo\underline{v}ed = movt$ He moved his car to the other side of the street.

blocked = blockt The car blocked the street.

discussed = discusst The class discussed the topic.

changed = changt The teacher changed the assignment.

encouraged = encouragt My mother encouraged me to learn English.

 $as\underline{k}ed = askt$ I asked a question about the homework.

 $pic\underline{k}ed = pikt$ He picked up his mat
